Cody, M.D., in her official capacity as Health Officer for the County of 26 Santa Clara (collectively, "Plaintiffs"), for a temporary restraining order and order to show cause 27 regarding issuance of a preliminary injunction against Defendants Mike McClure, Calvary Chapel 28

San Jose, and Does 1-50 (collectively, "Defendants"), came on for *ex parte* hearing on October 29, 2020, at 8:15 a.m., in Department 19 of the above-entitled court, located at 191 North 1<sup>st</sup> Street, San José, California 95113. Appearances were as stated in the record.

Based upon the papers submitted and argument of counsel, the Court finds that there is an immediate threat to public health and safety due to the SARS-CoV-2 novel coronavirus pandemic and that the conduct of Defendants violates the State and/or County public health orders aimed at abating the pandemic. In particular, Defendants have repeatedly ignored the earlier prohibitions and current limitations on indoor gatherings; failed to ensure those attending gatherings wear face coverings; failed to prevent those attending indoor gatherings from singing; and failed to submit and implement a Social Distancing Protocol. Based upon the papers submitted and argument of counsel, the Court finds these violations heighten the risk of transmission and community spread of COVID-19 and present a grave risk and immediate threat to public health, including the risk of serious illness and death. Defendants' repeated violations and pattern of defiance magnifies that threat and endangers not just those who attend Defendants' indoor gatherings, but also their families and friends and the public at large.

The Court further finds that Plaintiffs are likely to prevail on the merits of their Complaint and that the harm to the general public, including all residents of Santa Clara County, from the non-issuance of a restraining order outweighs the harm to Defendants from the issuance of a restraining order. Accordingly, the application is GRANTED as follows:

## TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Defendants Mike McClure, Calvary Chapel San Jose, and Does 1-50, and each of them, and their agents, employees, representatives, members, and volunteers, and all persons acting under, in concert with or for them, are hereby enjoined and prohibited from:

1. Conducting any gathering that does not fully comply with both the State and County public health orders, including but not limited to: holding gatherings indoors in excess of 100 people or 25% of capacity, whichever is less; holding outdoor gatherings in excess of 200 people; allowing participants to attend gatherings without wearing face coverings; allowing participants to attend gatherings without maintaining adequate social distance; and allowing singing at indoor gatherings;
